Elementary Turkish 1 (Turkish 101); Every Thursday at 6:00PM / Teacher: Bora Bali

About the Classes:

Turkic languages have a literary history which dates back more than 2,000 years. These languages are spoken by some 180 million people as a native language and the total number of Turkic language speakers is over 200 million including speakers as a second language.

The Turkish language spoken today in Republic of Turkey, which was modernized during the Turkish revolutionary independence movement of the first half of the twentieth century, is the language being taught in ATA-NC's Turkish classes.

The idea of learning Turkish is new to many Americans. With the increasing global importance of Turkey in the last couple of decades and as a result of rapidly growing number of Americans visiting Turkey, more and more Americans are interested in learning Turkish.

The following classes offered at ATA-NC attempt to help individuals who want to speak the Turkish language and learn more about the Turkish culture. Please note that **not** all classes are offered in the same semester. The classes are opened based on student demand and availability of our teachers.

Tuition & Rules:

1. Turkish Class Tuitions

- **10-week Semesters: \$150.00**
- **5-week Semesters/Sessions: \$75.00**

2. The registration forms can be downloaded from ATA-NC's Web site. Please fill out the registration form and bring it to the first class. The classes are open to adult students only (16 and older.)

3. The textbook for the classes is "*Teach Yourself Turkish, Complete Course*" by Asuman Çelen-Pollard, et al (ISBN 978-0071434225). Students should bring their own copy. A Turkish-English dictionary is also recommended. Dictionaries from the publisher Redhouse are good choices as they indicate suffix usages with particular Turkish words, which are very useful for beginners.

4. Although joining classes after the 2nd week of the semester is usually **not** permitted, it is left to teacher's discretion.

5. **Class tuitions are due before the 2nd week of the semester.** If you are permitted to join the class after the 2nd week, the full tuition is due when you start the classes. Please make checks payable to **ATA-NC**.

6. There may be extra classes at teacher's discretion. These will be announced during the semester.

7. As indicated on ATA-NC's Web site there are prerequisites for taking Turkish classes. If you have not completed the prerequisite of the class you would like to take, but believe that you have sufficient proficiency in Turkish for that level, you can contact the teacher to see if you can join the class. You may be asked to demonstrate your proficiency in Turkish.
